

ORDINANCES:

ORD07-05: AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS) AS THE BASIS FOR ALL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT IN THE BOROUGH OF PINE VALLEY

Section 1.

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD)-5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity; and

WHEREAS, the collective input and guidance from all Federal, State, local and tribal homeland security partners has been, and will continue to be, vital to the development, effective implementation and utilization of a comprehensive NIMS; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that all Federal, State, local and tribal emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management; and

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management it is critical that Federal, State, local and tribal organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualification standards, uniform standards for planning, training and exercising, comprehensive resource management and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters; and

WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel,

communications, facilities and resources will improve the State's ability to utilize federal funding to enhance local and state agency readiness, maintain first responder safety and streamline incident management processes; and

WHEREAS, the Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various incident management activities throughout the State, including current emergency management training programs; and

WHEREAS, the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks (911 Commission) recommended adoption of a standardized Incident Command System:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Commissioners of the Borough of Pine Valley, County of Camden, State, of New Jersey, by virtue of the authority vested in them by the Constitution and Laws of the State of New Jersey, do hereby establish the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the town standard for incident management.

Section 2. Any ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with this ordinance, are, to the extent of such inconsistencies, hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effective after Public hearing, adoption and publication in the manner prescribed by law.
