ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PINE VALLEY
PURSUANT TO N. J. STATUTES
PROVIDING FOR THE RECIPROCAL
PROVISION OF EMERGENCY
POLICE ASSISTANCE

WHEREAS, we live in a transient and society which tends to magnify the effects behavior and civil disorder; and

WHEREAS, the above factor can and h public safety crisis of a magnitude which the resources of the jurisdiction in which it oc

WHEREAS, N. J. Statute 40A:14-152 et al" tends to generally limit the jurisdiction public safety resources; and

WHEREAS, N. J. Statute 40A:14-156 provides the mechanism to exceed the aforementioned tions in answer to a social need;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by t body of the Borough of Pine Valley in the Cou and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. Pursuant to the provisions of NJS 40A governing body of the Borough of Pine agrees to the provision of reciprocal polic as hereinafter proscribed, with those muni ations in Camden County and in those cou uous to Camden County which demonstrate thei by their enactment of this resolution.
2. It is hereby expressly provided that upc such reciprocal police assistance, as proscribed, NO payment shall be required by the assisted municipality to the munic viding such assistance. This exclusion (but is not necessarily limited to) poli cost of automobiles, motor cycles, use of and/or the cost of other equipment or expe by providing such assistance. This provi payment is in lieu of those rates of pay set forth in NJS 40A:14-156 and as requ:
3. Any of the concurring parties may withd terminate their part in this Agreement of any calendar year, providing notice of s to terminate shall be given no later t list of each year to each participant herein the Agreement shall remain in force on a y

4. The "Mutual Aid Operations Plan" promulgated by the Camden County Chiefs of Police Association proscribing the specifics of emergency reciprocal police assistance is hereby incorporated by reference without inclusion herein. Such "Mutual Aid Operations Plan" will be periodically updated; but such updated version will not be enacted until distributed to each and every party hereto for their edification and whatever action they may deem appropriate.
5. The Chief of Police shall annually, and as soon after the end of the year as practicable, furnish the respective governing body with a summary report of services rendered and received with his comments and recommendations.
