

ORD 91-01  
 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ADOPTED JUNE 16, 1987 ENTITLED " AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PINE VALLEY ESTABLISHING A MANDATORY PROGRAM FOR THE SEPARATION OF USED NEWSPAPER, GLASS, USED METAL AND ALUMINUM CANS IN ORDER TO FACILITATE COLLECTION AND ENCOURAGE RECYCLING "

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Commission of the Borough of Pine Valley, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, that the Ordinance of June 16, 1987 as amended, entitled as above, be further amended to include as follows:

1. Section 1 is amended to include corrugated cardboard or paperboard used as boxes or containers.
2. Section 2 is amended to include leaves and corrugated cardboard for separation from solid waste. A provision also mandates separation and recycling of glass bottles and jars and aluminum, bi-metal and tin-plated steel containers from bars, taverns, restaurants, and institutional establishments; and high grade office paper including but not limited to, computer paper, copy paper and letter-head from commercial and institutional establishments; and corrugated cardboard from commercial, retail, wholesale and institutional establishments.
3. Section 3 is amended to include leaves for recycling are to be stored curbside in front of property or building for pick up during the late fall and early spring. During the winter and summer, leaves should be bagged and separated from other recyclable items.
4. This Ordinance repeals any ordinance previously adopted as inconsistent herewith but only to the extent of inconsistencies.
5. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty days after second reading, public hearing, adoption and publication as required by law.
